




Welcome to the 11th edition of the Berewood News.

As many of you will have seen there has been lots of activity on the development since our last publication.

Extensive conservation work has been completed on the River Wallington, increasing the natural habitats for the wildlife.

Waterlooville town centre hosted their first Car Meet on the Saturday, 25th May which was a huge success with lots more events planned over the summer (see details inside) as part of the town regeneration project. We are working with more partners than ever to give the residents information of activities / clubs and projects that are running in the local area. Latest Site Updates & Timescales

Please note these dates are estimates only and subject to change

- Bloor Homes building underway (Larkfields & Woodlands Edge)
- Redrow have also commenced on Kentish Coppice and Daubenton Glen being marketed collatively as Ash Gardens
- Berewood Town Park second phase estimated completion 2025
- Marrelsmoor Avenue final surfacing due early 2025
- Safe Routes to School due to complete 2025
- Newlands Avenue connection works to start mid 2024
- Northern allotments due to complete 2025
- Southern allotments due to complete 2025
- Second Primary School delivered by Hampshire County Council, planned to be open Sept 2025
- Community Nature Reserve (CNR) to include dog agility x 2 and play area due to complete 2025.



Planning Applications Update

New development proposals to be submitted

- Town Park Phase 2 Updated proposal plan for trim trails and removal of mounds following feedback received from the local community
- Community Nature Reserve (CNR) Improvements to play area, including additional parking
- Northern & Southern Allotments Northern allotments currently in planning under public consultation. Both Northern and Southern Allotments surveys currently being undertaken to compile all necessary information
- PROW Diversion of footpaths 729, 730 & 731 are now formally diverted and complete.

Reflecting and looking ahead

- Works have progressed on Marrelsmoor Avenue
- Undertaken essential tree safety works across the development site
- Remedials to the River Wallington
- Increased usage of the Newlands Community Hall
- Replanting scheme with a variety of 270 trees, replacing those that had died or were diseased. Tree planting event to take place in Autumn. Details to be shared on the website in due course
- Tree carvings to be created and sited in various locations around the Community Nature Reserve
- Removal of temporary car park at Town Park (July 2024).

You Asked... We Actioned!

Thanks to your feedback we are busy making improvements across Berewood

Additional bins have been installed with more to come as part of the Town Park Phase 2 works, as well as increased bin collections.

In collaboration with Newlands Community Group road remedials on Berewood Green were pursued with Barratts. Works have now commenced on site.

Residents highlighted issues with grass cutting and wild flower maintenance. Our new estate management contractor team are getting to know the development, we anticipate the current issues to be resolved in the coming months.

We are looking at holding a "You asked, We actioned" surgery once a month with the Council and other groups for residents to talk to us about the development and obtain local information. What would you like these sessions to look like? What partners would you also like to attend ...?

On Thursday, 12th September we will be holding a drop-in at the Newlands Community Hall. This will be between 3.30pm to 6.30pm. Please drop in to give us your thoughts, ideas, suggestions, questions where we can help.

- Safety first Wear reflective clothing and use lights, reflectors and a helmet
- Take it slow If you're just starting out, take a short, traffic-free route to boost your confidence on the bike first
- Service your bike Keep your bike road worthy with regular checks and services
- 4. Use a mudguard Helps keep you clean and dry when cycling in wetter weather
- Plan ahead Use sites like CycleStreets to plan your journey, customising the route to your fitness level and desired level of traffic

Wildlife watch

The wet weather has brought an abundance of wildlife to Berewood.



From the stunning Northern Lights to an Adder lazing in the sunshine. We have seen masses of wildlife activity on site. One of our biggest celebrations this year has been the Skylarks. There have been a number of nests identified by our ecologist Jeff Picksley "The skylark chick was found during a pre-works check for nesting birds. During the period March to July when works are scheduled that may impact on habitats that support nesting birds, checks are made by an ecologist in advance of the works and, if necessary, work areas or timings adjusted to accommodate nesting birds. This year works were postponed to allow nesting Dunnock, Moorhen and Skylark to complete breeding.

The orchid pictures are from the grass verge just opposite the community hall. Pyramidal orchid is scarce but widespread across the site and often occurs in the grass verges. Common spotted orchid is less common on site but is numerous in areas such as Newlands Meadow where it occurs in the uncut areas around the picnic benches. It also sometime occurs on the banks of SUDS features."

Spotlight on Waterlooville

This new section within the Newsletter will highlight local restaurants / cafes / entertainment spaces that are within easy access of the Berewood site.

For this issue we celebrate 'The Little Bay Eatery' in the centre of Waterlooville which offers a delicious array of homemade cakes and dishes. The breakfast is not to be missed either!.

Pete & Mel opened in March 2023, setting up this eatery with their customers tastes in mind, they knew what worked and have stuck to it. I asked Pete about their most popular dishes; "the liver and bacon is really popular, not many places do it around here and our customers love it, our lasagne is also a popular one. We have a vegan Mac 'n' Cheese and I recommend you try the Potato, Broccoli and Cheese Bake (vegan or gluten free options). "Mel was keen to share that "most of the dishes are prepared on site, we take real pride in sourcing our ingredients locally and giving really good sized portions. The eatery has become a real hub for local people and we know our customers very well, many visiting weekly."

Pete buys in from Big Hand, Little Hand in Southampton for their fresh coffee beans, eggs are sourced from Fowl Farm Free Range Eggs in Winchester, and the meat from Tendercut Butchers in Denmead (used in their delicious sausage rolls). "We see ourselves as a community focused local business, linking up with other businesses and charity / voluntary groups. Most Wednesdays we have the Dementia group visit, which is a highlight of the week for us."

It took me 15 minutes to stroll in from the Berewood development and enjoy a delicious lunch. I also took their details as they also deliver for parties / small group functions. Having just celebrated their most successful day on the Car Meet on 15th May this café is going from strength to strength, I'll be visiting again for sure!
