


The summer of 2025 has seen lots of activity in terms of new wildlife on the site and new spaces being developed: the second primary school opened along with the new play area, safe routes to school and the completion of the two allotments.

In this edition we get the opportunity to share all the exciting new facilities that were completed over the Summer and Autumn of 2025; Newlands Primary Academy, Northern & Southern Allotments, new play area, remedial works up at Town Park to the shelter & MUGA and the new Safe Routes to School footpath.



Latest Site Updates & Timescales

Please note these dates are estimates only and subject to change.

- Bloor Homes Larkfields and Woodlands Edge all
 properties have now been completed with remedials
 on going to the roads and surrounding areas. Phase 8
 (Park View) has now commenced with temporary access
 off London Road being used for construction site traffic.
- Redrow Homes Ash Gardens are progressing well with a significant number of properties now complete and occupied.
- Bargate Homes Located on Daubenton Glen and Maple Grove parcels. Currently seeking planning approval and anticipate to commence 2026.
- Persimmon Homes Located on the Barnfield parcel.
 Currently seeking planning approval and anticipate to commence 2026.
- Berewood Town Park Currently seeking planning approval anticipate to commence 2026
- Newlands Avenue Completed but not open for vehicular traffic
- Allotments Main works completed, final planting and weeding to be finalised over winter period with aim for adoption to Local Authority
- Two dog agility areas Works commencing 2026
- Play area adjacent to Southern Allotment completed and open for public use
- Community Nature Reserve Planting to be commenced over winter
- Safe Routes to School completed and open for public use
- Proxima Park Works have commenced on three new units with completion 2026
- Yew Gardens and Oak Vale roads currently being brought up to adoptable standard with completion expected early 2026
- Phase 4 and southern access junction due to commence 2026. Arboricultural and ecological surveys and works in operation currently
- Sports Pavillion Works commencing 2026
- Bulletin page A new page has been added to the Berewood website where any letters / notices with regards essential works will now be saved.

You Asked... We Actioned!

We held the drop-in surgery for residents on Tuesday, 14th October 2025.

- Residents had flagged with us that many of the dwarf walls in Phase 2 were crumbling, these were removed in the Autumn. We are now continuing with remedial works to Milk Lane, Newlands Avenue and Marrelsmoor Avenue (South) around the same time as Newlands Avenue was opened up creating additional parking for town park users.
- Following requests from residents, parking enforcement patrols were increased in the summer to deter visitors from parking on double yellow lines. Problems occurred with the cameras outside Berewood Primary. The Berewood team held immediate meetings with UKPC to have the cameras recalibrated and liaised with each of those affected to get a quick resolution to this issue.
- New estate management contractor is now in place.
 Residents had raised with us on numerous occasions issues of sub standard work and failure to maintain the areas of green space per the programme.
 Scandor joined the development in June and residents have been quick to praise the new team and notice an improvement site wide.

Travel Plan Coordinators




We are delighted to introduce ourselves as your Travel Plan Coordinators for Berewood!

Winter Walks

It's important to keep moving even in the winter months! Your home is well located to a number of Public Rights of Way (PRoW) routes, including footways and bridleways. A Public Right of Way is a legally protected path or route that the public can use. The map (to the left) shows your local area and the PRoW routes near to (or within) Berewood.

Footpath 279/729/1 is a 1.2km recreational route within the Berewood development, stretching from Ainsworth Road to Newland's Farm – why not try it and get some steps in?





Travelling by Bus

Your home is located within close proximity to a number of bus stops, depending on where you live within Berewood. The map (to the right) shows all the nearby bus stops to Berewood - these are all served by either Stagecoach or Firstbus, with frequent services to a range of locations.

Travelling by bus is a great way to get places quickly, but sustainably why not give it a go? As adult single bus journeys are still capped at £3 until at least March 2027, and might even be cheaper, so why not travel by bus!



Milk Lane/Newlands Avenue junction



Please note the changes to the traffic priorities at the Newlands Avenue & Milk Lane junction regarding the new t-junction

At a T-junction, traffic on the major road (Newlands Avenue) has priority. Vehicles on the minor road (Milk Lane) must give way to traffic on the major road and only proceed when it is safe to do so. You must give way to pedestrians waiting to cross the road you are turning into or from, and you should be cautious of cyclists and motorcyclists, who may be passing slower traffic.

Plot Lines is a creative project exploring the stories, voices and places that make up Waterlooville and its surrounding communities.


Through writing, art and conversation, we've been uncovering memories, ideas and connections – all shaped by the people who live here.

Over the coming months, we'll continue running free workshops and creative sessions locally. Keep an eye out for posters around the neighbourhood and follow us on



Enough volunteers have come forward for a new community speed watch group to start within Newlands Parish.

The group will be led by Cllr Paulette Bennett and Cllr Anthony Berry but operates separately from the Parish Council. The parish council have kindly agreed to purchase the necessary equipment, PPE and signage to start the group running, whilst also providing secure storage for the equipment.

Volunteers have been recruited from across the community, and anyone is welcome to join the team. The volunteers are currently undertaking the police training to carry out this role. Suitable points have been identified and will be confirmed shortly with Hampshire police. Once this is confirmed and all training has been carried out, the team will be out and about across the estate.

Shreducation



In the summer we had a chance to catch up with Bernie, a local parent who uses the Berewood skate park and was keen to start setting up regular scooting workshops and a dropin club. It's been a really exciting few months introducing Bernie to Community First and other local stakeholders so we can support Shreducation to evolve. This is such an exciting offer for young children in the area. Shreducation is now live, bringing together home education and scootering - learning by doing, riding with friends, and building real connections along the way.



Join our meet-ups where kids (approximate ages 6-12) can ride, learn new tricks, and have fun in a safe, supportive space. Professional scooter coach Danny Clements often joins to run skill sessions, giving riders the chance to progress at their own level.

A small £2 donation per session is welcome but never required - Shreducation is about community, not cost. As we grow, we'll head out on bigger adventures too, exploring UK skateparks alongside trips to museums, galleries, and exhibitions. If this sounds like your vibe, come join us and be part of the journey.

Dance Out Loud



Dance Out Loud has been offering Ballet and movement classes for children aged 18mths to 8yrs at Newlands Community Centre for over 5yrs now. Teaching little ones the magic of dance through story based learning, with lots of props and imagination. Each class is thirty minutes long and each



- Complete hearing checks for children
- Deliver a counselling service
- Respond to urgent referrals that require immediate support from Childrens Services, a GP or Children and Adolescent Mental health service (CAMHS).
- Deliver health training sessions to school staff [e.g. anaphylaxis, epilepsy]
- To offer a continence service

Who can access our services?

The School Nursing service provides health services for children and young people aged 5-19 who attend state funded schools within Hampshire [excluding Portsmouth and Southampton]. We also offer services to children and young people who are home educated. Hampshire and Isle of Wight Healthcare Foundation Trust offer immunisation programmes to children and young people attending private schools, however we are not currently commissioned to offer wider public health School Nursing services to children and young people in these schools.
